
A Message from the SIOMMMS President

elcome to Pisa and to the premier symposium for bone and mineral science in Italy, the SIOMMMS VI Annual Meeting. This year's meeting offers a well orchestrated array of presentations. Dr. Kanis is a well recognized leader in the area of osteoporosis risk assessment from The United Kingdom. We are excited to welcome Dr. D.M.Black to this year's Annual Meeting. Dr. Black's presentation "Building New Bone: a New Paradigm in Osteoporosis" is scheduled for Friday 24 at 1.15 p.m.

The seminar sessions will insure that several topics of interest in clinical practice will be discussed with experts in the field. The symposia will feature novel-



ties in both diagnostic and therapeutic approaches to metabolic bone disorders. We have also retained the popular Session "Bone Complications in Chronic Kidney Disorders" on Thursday 23 at 5.30 p.m.

We are proud to present this year the First Stroder/SIOMMMS Research Prize to be awarded on Friday 24 at 6.45 p.m.

Our Society is growing and we all need to work at the recognition of SIOMMMS as the foremost professional, scientific and medical Society for the promotion of bone and mineral research and the translation of that research into clinical practice.
